Item Discussion

1. Minutes from 5th November 2020: true and correct record.

2. Charity Commission and Policies:

TK reminded the committee to return the policies as soon as possible. TK discussed transferring the Charity Commission and bank account over to the new committee in Jan 2021.

3. Funding:

4. Stock and storage:

TK specifies that the shed needs to be vandal proof and around 14ft x 7ft to fit everything in.

The Gladiator Plus 2 is one of our extra-large all metal sheds. Just like all of our other high-quality products, the Gladiator Plus 2 is built from very thick, heavy-

gauge, galvanised (weatherproof) steel panels. This all-metal shed is designed to keep both the bad weather and the thieves out. This extra-large metal shed has a tough, (pick and drill resistant) with a secure 5 point locking system featuring internal deadbolts. 10yr warranty.

The committee agreed that it would be suitable for purpose. GP got the price reduced from \pounds 1899 to \pounds 1800. It will require a floor which is another \pounds 210 plus a hard standing.
