KFC Meeting: TK discussed the meeting she had with Lynsey Galley at KFC on Tuesday 19th March.

Lynsey explained that they wanted to support the school in any way that they can. They would advertise under the business name of 1st Rate Investments and not KFC.

7 Funding

Football Kit

TK created an order for the football kit and the spares. Delivery within 2 to 3 weeks.

Daily Mile Track

Tk had a meeting with DCM & Matt on 28th March.

Points discussed:

- School need permission from LCC to lay the track as the school do not own the grounds
- DCM will spray the outline first and get approval from school before commencing work
- DCM discussed the process
- The materials etc will be delivered the night before to a secure area (probably the hard-standing circles) for health and safety reasons.
- Samples left in the office for CC and JW to look at
- Date for laying the track depends on LCC permission but hopefully before sports day in June
- Total cost of the track: £13 320 + VAT

TK in discussions with school to see how much Sports Premium funding we will receive and when. TK also to contact 1st Rate Investments to see how much they are willing to donate.

The committee are concerned that it will take a large bulk of the funds that we have available.

A decision was made by the committee, when we formed, that we would make sure that we would always have around £2000 in the bank to fund future events.

TK explained that she had discussed paying $\frac{3}{4}$ of the payment upon completion (£9,990) and DCM have agreed that the remaining $\frac{1}{4}$ (£3,330) could be paid at a different time.

TK also explained that the invoice would be sent to school, so we don't have to pay VAT. The PFA would transfer the monies to school.

The committee was adamant that until the funding for the last quarter was secure that we shouldn't go ahead with the work.
