

ACTIVITIES:

Auction?? Discussed and thought it should have a separate evening. Didn't quite work at the summer fair but the sound system was down. Do we give it another go???

Craft: Lots of things that can be done with craft but it needs its own space. Discussed Angela taking a lead on this one to promote Get Crafty.

Sarah's Balloon Extravaganza: Our very own Sarah Riggott and her fantastic balloon skills.

Bauble Bobbing: Similar to hook a duck so already got resources

Bauble bobbing – Similar to a 'hook the duck' game, fill a paddling pool with Styrofoam shapes and Christmas baubles. Participants hook the baubles out of the pool. Each bauble has a different coloured spot, each colour representing a prize.

Choco Cards: Already got cards – just need chocolate - donations

Choco cards – Lay one pack of cards out on a table, placing a wrapped chocolate on some of the cards, with booby prizes or nothing on the others. The children choose a card from another pack, and win whatever is on the corresponding card.

Drop the coin on the Reindeers Nose: Easy, Quick, Completive

Drop the coin on Rudolph's nose – Fill a big tub of water and drop a laminated picture of Rudolph in the bottom. Land a 50p on his nose to win, an easy money spinner.

Face Painting and Nail Art: Again, a no brainer! Always a hit. Resources available.

Face painting – Think festive: snowmen, reindeer and snowflakes and swirls.

Nail stall – Nail painting is always popular. Use quick dry nail paint and use nail art pens to allow you to quickly draw designs: polka dots, flowers and snowflakes are easy and eyecatching.

Giant Snowman: A bit like the bean bag toss but will make it out of MDF to stand up.

Giant snowman – Draw a giant snowman with holes cut out and get children to throw three balls, a prize for getting a ball through a hole.

Gift Room JP explain

Knock Santa off the chimney – A simple but fun game, just like the funfairs do it, sit a stuffed Santa on a platform decorated like a chimney; three chances to win by knocking Cresswite Reindeers Birthday

Guess the reindeer's birthday – A good game to play to relieve the wait outside Santa's Grotto, rather than a money maker.

Mince Pie Madness

Mince pie madness – Create out of cardboard/ hardboard a large Santa's face and cut out a hole where his mouth should be. Children can aim mince pie shaped toys at his mouth and win prizes for getting any in. Remember to make it trickier for older participants.

Pin the Nose

Pin the nose – Just like pin the tail on the donkey! Rudolph, Olaf (Frozen) and other Christmas characters are fun to use and prove very popular.

Photo Booth: Different ideas of how to run it.

Photo booth – Gather the silliest Christmas hats, funky glasses, tinsel, and decorations to create a Christmas booth. Add a homemade Christmas frame for fun. Find a quiet space, borrow a camera and offer to email/print the pictures for a cost. Make it a challenge, the silliest photo of the day wins a prize. Stuck for a photographer? "Let the Y6 run it as a selfie booth and charge per person rather than per photo"

Personalised Christmas Bauble

Personalised Christmas bauble – "At a recent Christmas fair, a lady had boxes of red, blue and silver baubles. For £1 each, she personalised one of your choice with child's name just using a silver pen. She must have made a fortune as she sold out quickly." Pop the decorated bauble in a paper bag with tissue paper in to make it feel extra-special. Children will also love this if you offer to write a message on it "Love you, Mum/ Best Dad in the World", with their name; great present idea for kids to give relatives, and a lovely keepsake for the recipient.

Rudolph's Magic Carrots

Rudolph's magic carrots – All that's needed for this one is a bunch of carrots, a coloured pen, a tray of sand and some cheap prizes. Put Rudolph's carrots in the sand and pull them out to find a winner (the ones with coloured tips)!

Where's Santa?

Where's Santa? – Create a map of the world to guess where Santa is. Get children to put a sticker or pin where they think he is and record their details against it. Later on, pull a country out of a hat and the winner gets a stocking filled with goodies.

STALLS

Cake Stall: Obvious one. Always does well. Donations of Cakes.

Sweet/chocolate Stall: Obvious one. Always does well. Donations of sweets/chocolate

Book Stall: Again, rely on donations

Uniform Stall: Instead of Oct.

Class Stalls: Will Mrs. W go for it!!

Class stalls – Each class runs their own stall and spends as little as possible in the race to making the most money. Teachers and children to staff the stalls and a prize goes to the class stall that raises the most. "Class stall competitions on who can raise the most money is always a huge hit."

Coloured stalls – Each class/ year group has a different colour and children bring in things new and old of that colour, with teachers of that class/ year staffing the stall. "Kids love it, it's like a swarm of locusts over the stall and most items are sold really quickly – within one hour."

Pet's corner – Make up your own stockings for pets by buying bits and pieces from a wholesaler, including a ribbon and a gift tag.

Hot chocolate reindeer cones – Make up hot chocolate cones to look like Rudolf. Fill a plastic cone with powdered hot chocolate at the bottom and fill the top half with mini marshmallows. Draw a reindeer face on the cone and tie it with festive ribbon.

- 1 Hot Chocolate envelope We used these Swiss Miss hot chocolate packets
- 2 tbsp Mini Chocolate Chips
- 1/3 cup Mini Marshmallows
- 1 Red Pom Pom Ball
- 2 Google Eyes
- 1 Rubber band
- 1 Brown Pipe Cleaner Glue
